Sandy's Snippets

Straightening the Grain of Woven Fabric

Do you always determine if your woven fabric is *grain*-perfect before you cut into it? Working with *off-grain* fabric can cause disastrous results in any garment, quilt or home-decorating project. So, use one of these three preferred methods to make sure your fabric is cut *on-grain*. It's always best to check the *grain*, instead of trusting our eye!

1. With firmly woven fabrics, clip into the crosswise *grain*, along the selvedge edge, about 1" - far enough away from the fabric's cut edge to be able to grasp both sides of the cut. Forcefully rip the fabric apart, revealing the *straight-of-grain* line on the crosswise grain. The torn edge will be ravelly, but it can be pressed flat with steam. If the selvedge edges seem to be wavy, or crooked, use the same method along the lengthwise *grain*, thereby eliminating the selvedge edge on one side. It can be used as a stabilizer along shoulder seams in a knit garment, among other things. Be creative!
2. With soft, stretchy, or loosely woven fabrics, cut into the selvedge edge about 1". Spread the fabric apart to expose a single thread. Gently pull the thread parallel to the cut end, or crosswise *grain*. A line will appear where the thread has been pulled. You will have to "gather" the fabric along the way as you are pulling the thread. If the thread breaks, just spread the fabric apart, again, and pick up the thread that appears, and continue the entire width of the fabric. Cut along that line to find the perfect *grain* line.
3. Steaming natural fiber fabrics, such as silk, wool, linen or cotton, is an effective way to straighten the *grain*. Match up the selvedge edges and the cut ends. Check for wrinkles along the fold. If you see wrinkles forming, unfold the fabric and stretch by pulling at opposite ends along the bias. Re-fold and check for wrinkles. Repeat, if necessary, until the fabric lays flat and smooth. Press (don't iron) with lots of steam to set the straightened *grain*.

With either Method 1 or 2, fold the fabric lengthwise, matching selvedge edges and cut (or torn) ends. If the ends won't stay together without force and stubborn wrinkles appear near the fold (and Method 3 doesn't work), the entire piece of fabric is *off-grain*. Check the fabric bolt end for information about the fabric's finish. If it's been treated with a permanent press finish, straightening the *grain* will be impossible, so don't use it! Once the *straight-of-grain* has been determined on one side of the fabric, that side can then be used to true-up the rest of the piece before cutting out your project.

I know this all sounds like some extra work – it is. However, if you spend just a little extra time following one of these methods, you can be assured that your project will turn out with the exceptional quality results that you like to see!

This holds your place in the class. There are supply lists for every class. Please make sure you receive the supply list for your class to enable you to prepare properly.

PRIVATE LESSONS are available at Austin's. Please call with your needs and one of our knowledgeable teachers will contact you to set up a convenient time for your lessons.

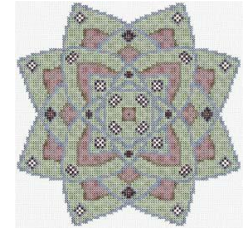

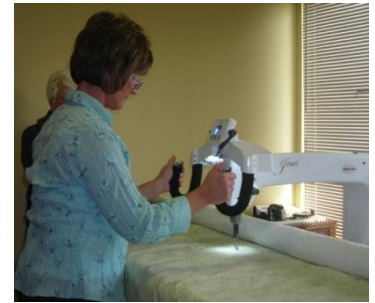
